
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
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REFLECTIONS

FOUNDER CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE



Creating an enabling environment for citizens to enjoy good quality life is the goal of any polity. The good news is that the country is in a growth phase, thanks to the wonderful work done by various stakeholders in community service. The bad news is we still have to address many more challenges!

From regional disparity to unemployment and status of women to undernourished kids, India has several pain points, which require serious contemplation and robust solutions. Traditional thinking and 'business as usual approach' will not be able to fix these burning issues. "Out-of-the-box" thinking and wholehearted community participation is the need of the hour.

We formed Manav Sadhan Vikas Sanstha (MSVS), a public charitable trust, more than two decades ago to engage community leaders, domain experts and the Government in various developmental initiatives. The vision was to create a workable and replicable model of holistic human development. Empowering community for proactive participation and enabling it to evolve its own development agenda was at its core. We roped in diverse talent to integrate economic, physical, social, ecological, intellectual and spiritual aspects in our developmental strategy.

MSVS was conceived as a pan India movement. In the first phase, we chose Konkan on the west coast of Maharashtra for our projects. Konkan was underdeveloped, more importantly; I was representing this region in the Parliament. Education, livelihood generation through skilling, health care, women empowerment, building entrepreneurs through self-help groups,

popularizing technology, and environment conservation, were some of our thrust areas.

We focused on institutionalization, cadre building and proactive participation of the community. Our activities revolved around six target groups– women; farmers; youth; backward classes; fishing community; and ex-servicemen. The 'chain of volunteers' connecting the smallest unit (village) to the district headquarters and the State capital was the USP of MSVS.

We started about 105 "Parivartan Kendras" (Transformation Centers). There was a Parivartan Kendra each for a group of ten villages. Each Kendra had a gymnasium; employability training cell; Internet kiosk and library and an eco club. It was also a platform for local arts and crafts. A nursing school, a skill development institute called Jana Shikshan Sansthan, a program to computerize the region's schools, Eco clubs, were among our first few successes. In 2011, MSVS launched employability skills programs in Mumbai, and later scaled it up to various parts of Greater Mumbai.

MSVS is in an expansion mode. The construction of its Head Quarters at Kopar Khairane, Navi Mumbai is in full swing. The bhoomi puja of the Jana Shikshan Sansthan's Resource Center, Kudal has been a much talked about event. While it is collaborating with the best of the national and international brands for quality skills, it is heartening to note that MSVS has remained at its core, an institute for the people, by the people and of the people.

2017-18 turned out to be an eventful year. There is lot of good news to convey. First and foremost, Manav SadhanVikas Sanstha (MSVS), which is doing a wonderful job for the poor and needy, turned 21. From a fledgling institute operating from a municipal school in North West Mumbai, MSVS has crossed many milestones and has achieved a great deal.

We have been focusing mainly on education and skill development in the recent years. We will have reached out to more than 80,000 beneficiaries through our various programs including General Nursing and Midwifery Diploma (GNM), Paramedical Courses, Yoga therapy and Employability Skills programs in Sindhudurg district and Mumbai.

The construction of our Skills and Entrepreneurship Development Institute (S&EDI) at Koparkhairane, Navi Mumbai is progressing rapidly. By the beginning of 2019, we will have our own building. Our S&EDI will be a unique concept. The approach will be two pronged. Each department– whether it is beauty and wellness or food processing and fashion designing– will have training cum service center. Students will run the service center during their training period to hone their skills and reach the desired level of competency.

Soon MSVS will have reached another milestone. Its Jana Shikshan Sansthan that imparts employability skills too will have its own resource center at Orasin Sindhudurg district soon. We just concluded the Bhoomi Pujan of the project. The illustrious personalities who graced the occasion, included Nitin Gadkari, Hon. Road Transport and national High Ways Minister; Suresh Prabhu, Hon. Railway Minister; Devendra Fadnavis, Chief Minister of Maharashtra; Uddhav Thackray, Shiv Sena Chief, among others.

Going forward, we are collaborating and associating with renowned brands to impart state-of-the-art skills and life skills training to our students to enable them to attain economic independence and security. We are looking at evolving new age programs and creating a holistic ecosystem where students are not only skilled and tracked during and post their education, but also helped in job placements and entrepreneurship development. We welcome the next decade of work and progress with a lot of aspiration, anticipation and ambition.

MILESTONES

ACTIVITIES OF MSVS SINCE INCEPTION

Manav Sadhan Vikas Sanstha (MSVS) a public charitable trust formed in 1997, seeks to bring about a holistic and integrated development of underprivileged communities, and underdeveloped regions through proactive participation of both– governmental and non-governmental stakeholders.

MSVS visualizes a type of development that integrates economic, social, physical, ecological, intellectual and spiritual aspects in a holistic manner. The mission of MSVS is to promote a holistic and integrated development of underprivileged communities and underdeveloped regions.

The Objectives of MSVS include:

- Community development through Education and employability skills programs
- Women Empowerment
- Natural resource management
- Employment generation/ Entrepreneurship development
- Institutionalization and creation of a committed cadre
- Rural development by providing basic amenities and sustainable livelihood

Activities of MSVS:

1. Jana Shikshan Sansthan, Sindhudurg

Established in 2001, Jan Shikshan Sansthan Sindhudurg (JSSS) aims to extend non-formal education to the marginalized and underprivileged sections in the region, thereby making them self-reliant and empowered. Ours was the first rural JSS in the country. With the support of the Skill and Entrepreneurship Development Ministry, Government of India, JSSS runs vocational education programs for the school dropouts, neo-literates, illiterates and marginalized persons in Sindhudurg district. Over 70,000 people have benefitted so far from various training programs conducted by JSSS, 85 per cent of these are women. JSS is coming up with its new building at Oras on a plot of land obtained from the Collector of Sindhudurg District.

2. Computer Education through Ford Foundation

Between 2000 and 2006, MSVS developed a project with the support from Ford Foundation to strengthen the school computer laboratories, guiding and training the potential school teachers to implement the government curriculum for the students of 8th, 9th and 10th standards in selected schools in the target region. The project benefitted twenty teachers and about 2000 students along with 5000 other residents connected with schools and the students, who could get awareness about the computer education through various village meeting organized by MSVS with the help of the project teacher during the project period.



3. Parivartan Kendras or Transformation Centers

MSVS set up 'Parivartan Kendras' (PKs) or transformation centers – for over all transformation of the people living in villages. We established a transformation center each for a cluster of 10 villages in Sindhudurg district and 105 such centers were formed. Today 46 of these 105 centers are active. 'Parivartan Kendras' were perceived as a hub of development activities. Each of these centers was equipped with a gymnasium for physical development, skills training through JSSS for economic development, computer training for intellectual development. In addition it held sports competitions, health camps, cultural programs, for social and cultural development.

4. Dyanada (Internet Kiosks)

MSVS introduced information technology to the people of Konkan through Dyanada. In co-operation with the National Informatics Centre, MSVS coined a comprehensive, three-phased program of setting up Internet Kiosks at the block headquarters. Ten such centers were established. Information pertaining to various government schemes, agricultural practices, land record forms, application forms for various certificates issued by the local government was made available to the needy at these Internet access centers at the click of the mouse. The late Dr. Abdul Kalam, former President of India, launched this program just before he became the President. It was this MSVS experiment in a rural setting that had inspired the late President to deliver his famous speech on digital divide.

5. Mobile Hospital

MSVS launched its "health of the wheels" program around 2000. It started a mobile diagnostic clinic to transport medical care to the remotest hamlets of the Sindhudurg district and a few tehsils of the neighbouring Ratnagiri district. The program was funded by Organization of Pharmaceutical Producers' India (OPPI).

6. Eco Clubs

With financial assistance from Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India, MSVS organized Eco Club in 100 schools for creating environmental awareness among students.

7. Grameen Gyan Abhiyan

MSVS in collaboration with NIIT and ICICI Limited set up Minimally Invasive Education (MIE) kiosks in predominantly rural and under-developed areas of Sindhudurg district like Banda, Deobagh, Shirgaon, Kalse, and Talawade in Sindhudurg district, Maharashtra, with the aim of testing the concept of minimally invasive education. Unmanned kiosks were started to provide the children from the fishing and farming community an exposure to computers. The Centre for Knowledge Societies certified these centers in 2000.

8. The Global Environmental Facilities (GEF) Small Grants Programme

With the help of GEF grants MSVS established "Centers of Learning" in secondary schools in Sindhudurg and Ratnagiri districts for promoting local response to Biodiversity conservation. The goal and purpose of the project was to bring about awareness in school children regarding conservation of natural resources of the target region. Various techniques were used to sensitize the youth. The list included a survey of the regions flora and fauna, creation of gardens of medicinal plants; demonstration plots of endangered species of plants and ecologically vital herbs.

9. School of Nursing

MSVS established School & College of Nursing, first of its kind, in a village called Anav in Sindhudurg district in 2001. The institute, now in its 18th year, caters exclusively to the girls from this economically backward region. The nursing institute presently imparts General Nursing and Midwifery (GNM) Diploma, and a few paramedical courses. The institute, which is affiliated to the National and State nursing council has, so far trained 300 nurses, who are gainfully employed in various well known hospitals in Mumbai, Pune, Kolhapur, Ratnagiri and Belgaum.

10. Employability Skills Programs in Mumbai

MSVS launched employability skills programs in Mumbai's shanties in 2011 to enable underprivileged women and men to become self-reliant and live life with dignity. MSVS's skill menu includes beauty and hair care, henna body art, tailoring, fashion designing and embroidery, artificial jewelry, welding and fabrication, plumbing, and refrigeration and AC repair. The project has been able to reach over 2,000 beneficiaries so far.

11. Skill and Entrepreneurship Development Centre

MSVS established a Skill & Entrepreneurship development Institute in 2018 on a plot of land (No. 27) awarded by CIDCO at Kopar Khairane, Navi Mumbai. The institute is under construction and will be open to service from April 2019 onwards.

The facility in collaboration with well-known brands will impart state-of-the-art employability skills to the needy and create livelihood opportunities. Courses such as Beauty and Wellness, Fashion Designing, Optical, Driving cum Tourist guides and Health Workers, Culinary Skills/ Bakery/ Food processing, Jewelry Making, Home Managers, Computer Education, English Speaking will be conducted. Each training center will also double as service center to make students job ready. Students will also gain soft skills like financial training and digital literacy.

MSVS Skill Development Activities at Mumbai:

MSVS trained close to 430 women in different employability skills like basic and advance beauty care, fashion designing, preparing spice mix, jewelry making, henna application, etc.

In addition to the above, 69 students from previous year's batches completed courses during this year and got certified.

During the year 2 new centers (Vadab and Jambivali villages at Karjat) were added to the existing 8 centres (Nallasopara, Thane, Andheri, Kandivali, Bhoiwada, Worli, Jogeshwari, Kurla)

The activity, MSVS's innovation, involves on-the-job training to students. Trainees provide various services in the beauty and wellness genre to interested people in a particular locality, where the camp is being held free of charge. This helps boost the moral and confidence of the students. They also get recognition for their skill in that locality and this increases the possibility of these students getting job work. The present demos helped the trainees to reach out to 175 people.

Collaboration and Co-operation:

MSVS forged new bonds during the year. In collaboration with Jana Pragati Centres of Jana Group, MSVS launched five training centers for women of the locality. The centres were located at Jana Pragati centres's premise at Andheri, Kandivali, Nallasopara and Thane. Jana Pragati supported the programme by mobilising candidates for the training and also by providing space for the conduction of the trainings.

The partnership with the Omkar Foundation continued in 2017-18 with MSVS running centers in Worli, Bhoiwada, and Jogeshwari. Omkar Foundation supported the programme by providing venue for the training and also by providing financial assistance for the conduction of trainings.

In collaboration with Seva Sahayog Foundation, MSVS conducted training programs in tailoring and making 'spice mix' in Jambivali and Vadab villages near Karjat. Seva Sahayog foundation mobilised the women for training, provided space and also supported with financial assistance.



Convocation:

427 students from 45 batches were awarded certificates during the convocation ceremonies at various centres. The convocation ceremony at Kurla centre was graced by Mrs. Uma Prabhu, Chairperson of MSVS along with representatives of Bhagini Mandal, Kurla. A certification programme was also organised at the Karjat centre in coordination with Seva Sahayog Foundation in presence of Sanjay Hegde, MSVS Trustee and office bearers of the Foundation.



Soft Skill Sessions:

In a bid to add value to training programs at various locations like Thane, Andheri, Nala Sopara, Worli, external experts were brought in to conduct informative sessions on self awareness, communication skills, management of emotions, creative thinking, critical thinking etc. About 200 women benefitted from 9 special sessions that were conducted during this period.



Health Awareness Workshops:

MSVS also organized several awareness sessions on important issues such as women's health, breast cancer, uterus cancer, health & hygiene, menarche and menopause, nutrition etc. Dr. Anil Nerurkar, MSVS Trustee, Dr. Yogita Mandle, Associate Professor at D.Y Patil Medical College, Ms. Diana Fernandez, Health Education Officer, Health Promotion Trust, were some of the speakers. Over all 474 people benefitted from the 21 workshops held during the year to promote health awareness. The women from Andheri, Bhoiwada, Kurla, Nallasopara, Thane, Kandivali, Worli, Lower Parel, Karjat, Jogeshwari and Koparkhairanewere benefitted by these sessions.





Vacation Trainings for Children:

MSVS conducted four days training sessions in arts like Lamp painting, jewelry making, and creating “best out of waste” for about 55 children belonging to the age group 11 to 13 years at Vasai to engage them during their vacations.

School of Nursing Activities

Nursing: A Transformative Profession

Manav Sadhan Vikas Sanstha's School of Nursing (SoN) stepped into its 17th year. Seventy-five students completed various educational programs like Post Basic B.Sc.; General Nursing and Midwifery (GNM) Diploma, and Certificate Programs in some Paramedical Courses.

MSVS's School of Nursing organised a day long symposium to highlight the role of the nursing profession in global transformation.

SoN organized a daylong, district level symposium at its campus at Village Anav December 15, 2017. "Role of nursing in global transformation" was the theme of the event. About 217 delegates participated, which included students and faculty of 3 nursing schools and 3 nursing colleges in Sindhudurg district.

Dr. R.S. Kulkarni, who was the chief guest at the inaugural function, highlighted the importance of nursing. "Nursing is one of the few trusted careers," he mentioned. Dr. Sharad Sawant, Trustee, MSVS, who presided over the function spoke. Smt. Uma Prabhu, Chairperson, MSVS, and Shri Baban Salgaonkar, Mayor of Sawantwadi and SoN Local Committee Member, graced the function.

Panel discussions were held on the following topics:

- Global health, global perspective – new challenges and opportunities for nurses
- Technological advancement and innovative approaches in nursing practice

Mrs. Swati Bedekar, Director of Vatsalya Foundation, Vadodara was the guest speaker. She gave information on health and hygiene, sanitary napkins training & development, manufacturing unit etc. Smt Suneetha Poojary, CEO, MSVS & Dr. Preeti Sawant, staff and students of SoN and JSSS team participated in the discussion. The highlight of the programme was participation by women from various parts of Sindhudurg district who are part of JSS activities. The women also showed keen interest in taking up manufacturing of sanitary napkins.

International Yoga Day:

3rd year students of GNM performed Yoga at Rani Janaki Bai Ayurvedic Mahavidyalaya on June 21, 2017 to mark the International yoga day. A discussion on the importance and benefits of Yoga was held at the SoN campus.

CREATING AN EDIFICE

Bhoomi Pujan of the Resource Centre of Jana Shikshana Sansthan Sindhudurg & inauguration of the Community Hall at the School of Nursing, Anav

July 23, 2017 will go down in the history of Manav Sadhan Vikas Sanstha as a major landmark in its transformative journey. It was on this day that the Bhoomi Pujan of Jana Shikshana Sansthan Sindhudurg's resource center at Oras, took place with much fanfare and aplomb. The day also marked the inauguration of a multipurpose hall constructed at its School of Nursing campus at village Anav. The latter has been constructed with the help of Shri. Piyush Goyal's, Hon. Minister of State (independent charge) of Power MPLAD funds.

It was sheer pleasure to witness MSVS's fledgling skill development institute, creating a facility of its own and with its own resources. The well-orchestrated ceremony that took place at Maratha Samaj Sabhagruha, Kudal, saw participation of big wigs like Shri Suresh Prabhu, Railway Minister and Founder Chairman of MSVS and JSS, Sindhudurg; Shri Devendraji Fadnavis, Chief Minister, Maharashtra; Shri Nithin Gadkari, Minister for Road Transport, Highways, Shipping, Govt. of India;

Shri Uddhav Thackeray, Chief of Shiva Sena Party; Shri Anant Geete, Union Minister of Heavy Industries & Public Enterprise; Mr. Ramdas Atawale, Minister for State for Social Justice and Empowerment.

Also present on the dais were representatives of the Maharashtra Cabinet like Shri Chandrakant Patil, Minister of Revenue and public works, GoM;

Shri Deepak Kesarkar, Home minister, GoM and Shri Ravindra Chawan, Minister for Ports, Medical education, Information and Technology, Food and Civil Supplies, Consumer Protection, GoM; Smt Rashmi Thakray, Smt Uma Prabhu, Chairperson of MSVS; Shri Vaibhav Naik, MLA, Kudal Malwan Assembly constituency; Shri Baban Salgaonkar, Mayor, Sawantwadi; Shri Rajan Teli, Ex MLC and Shri Atul Kalsekar, President, BJP, Sindhudurg.

In his power packed address, Maharashtra Chief Minister Shri Devendra Fadnavis lauded Manav Sadhan Vikas Sanstha's efforts for launching a skill development institute (JSS) to upgrade the lot of underprivileged people. "MSVS was much ahead of its time," he said adding that the Public Charitable Trust started imparting livelihood skills at a time when no one, not even the government thought about bringing about a change through skilling. Shri Fadnavis congratulated Jana Shikshana Sanstha for training over 65,000 people in different skills and helping them get gainful employment.

Shri Prabhu set the ball rolling by extending a warm welcome to the dignitaries on the dais. He said JSS Sindhudurg has the unique distinction of being the first rural jana Shikshana Sansthan in the country. Prior to 2001, JSS was known as Shramik Vidyapith and was established only in urban areas to help ameliorate conditions of mill workers and laborers.



Going forward, MSVS plans to establish a Skills Cum Entrepreneurship Development Institute at Koparkhairane, Navi Mumbai. It will have its own building at Kopar Khairane in Navi Mumbai on a plot of land about 5500 sq. ft. in area. The construction of the new building is in full swing and is likely to be completed in the beginning of 2019.

The institute will collaborate with top brands on skills training in order to impart state-of-the-art employability skills to the needy and create livelihood opportunities for them.

Courses such as Beauty and Wellness, Fashion Designing, Optical, Driving cum tourist guides and health workers, Culinary skills/ Bakery/ Food processing, Jewelry making, Home Managers, Computer education, English speaking will be conducted by renowned trainers at nominal charges for the members of the underprivileged communities.



Entrepreneurship development Institute, Koparkhairane, Navimumbai

Students will receive on-the-job training at the service centers attached to the training center at out ESDI. Each course will have a soft skills module to make students in to holistic personalities.



JSS Resource Centre, Sindhudurg

At our nursing complex at village Anav in Sindhudurg district, we are planning to add on more paramedical courses, which fetch jobs more easily. Talks are on to start Ayush programs like Panchakarma and different therapies, which are much in demand.

INSPIRING TALES

AGAINST ALL ODDS....

Smt. Bharati Sawant and Smt. Pragnya Navrat were two physically challenged women from Santacruz, who never thought that some day they would be able to stitch clothes. Sawant was walking on artificial legs as she had lost both her lower limbs years back. Navrat's story was different. She was a polio victim since her childhood. Moved by their plight and encouraged by their strong desire to learn, MSVS took up the challenge of training these two women for tailoring skills. Smt. Mohini Sharma, tailoring Master, worked hard on teaching the women in pedaling the sewing machine and adjusting the cloth while sewing, two activities viewed as difficult taking into consideration their handicap. The teacher's commitment and the two students' efforts paid rich dividend. Both Sawant and Navrat passed with flying colours. This indeed was a proud moment for manav Sadhan Vikas Sanstha, which is committed to serving the vulnerable sections of society.



DESIGNING DESTINY

Mr. Naresh Kalmetar hails from the underprivileged fishing community in Sindhudurg. "Both- my wife and I got trained at Jan Shikshan Sansthan Sindhudurg in spinning coir yarn and making products out of it. We mastered the skill and at the same time learned entrepreneurial skills too. My 'Certificate' enabled me to procure a loan to start my own small unit. I make coir yarn, coir handicrafts, wall hangings etc. I also make handicrafts from seashells. I have a handicraft stall at the Malvan Beach, which is a popular tourist destination. During the tourist season, I make anywhere between Rs.10, 000/- to 12,000/- per day by selling my products. Coir Board, Bangalore and Khadi Gramodyog (KVIC) have helped me to expand my business and now I employ about 100 women," says Kalmetar. Kalmetar also trains students in making coir and seashell handicrafts. He has trained over 400 students.

'TOP' FORM

Smt. Sunita Sudan Naik from Kankavli, Sindhudurg dreamt of becoming an entrepreneur, but she knew she would need to learn some skills to realize her dreams. "I had heard about MSVS's institute, which was training rural masses for employability skills. I enrolled for the Incense Sticks, Candle and Detergent Powder Making course. I not only learned the skill but also got information about how to become an entrepreneur, how to procure finance, and how to start my own unit. This experience enriched me and helped me to realize my dream."

After completing the training Naik started her own business in detergent powder making. She enrolled with DIC for branding of her detergent powder under the brand name "Top Detergent". She says proudly -"Today my detergent powder is being sold under the brand name 'Top' all over the district. I also make bath soaps, incense sticks and candles under this brand." Naik had to face many hurdles in the beginning in marketing her products, as she had to compete with many established companies.

"I did not lose my optimism and moved ahead with courage. I roped in women's Self Help Groups (SHGs) from the area, which is a huge network, for marketing my products and making my brand's publicity. In this way I increased my sales. Training imparted by JSS transformed my life and turned me into a successful entrepreneur. I wish to help other women in transforming their lives too."



A BEAUTIFUL MIND

When she enrolled for the Beauty Care – Basic course at MSVS training centre at Santacruz in 2015, Smt. Kiran Bhoir she was just 17. She had finished her 10th grade. Since she did not enjoy academics, Kiran decided to learn something different so that she could earn and support her parents. She was good in practical work but theory was her weak point. However, during her advance course, she put in a lot of hard work and completed the course with outstanding performance. Even before her course was over, Kiran was getting job work for different beauty treatments. After her course she took up a job at a parlor. Soon she upgraded herself by completing a 'Makeup artist course'. At present she is working as a teaching facility in same institute.

Kiran is also resource person for various workshops that MSVS conducts. "MSVS has molded my personality and taught me skills which has made me to live a better life. I am proud to visit MSVS training center as resource person," she says.



JEWEL IN A CROWN

A student of Jewelry Making and Henna Application batch of 2016 at MSVS's Bhoiwada centre, Vaishali Gaonkar was a smart girl. She had passed the 10th grade. Hailing from a big family of 7 sisters, Vaishali started working at very early age to support her mother. When MSVS opened a training center in her Bhoiwada area in collaboration with Omkar Foundation, Vaishali proactively took an initiative to mobilize women for the trainings.

After completing a course in jewelry making, Vaishali set up her own venture– she started taking orders. Now she has her own business of jewelry products. She creates designs on her own. Her husband supports her in her business and her sisters help in marketing the products. She also sells her products at the exhibitions.



MASALA CRAFT

MSVS collaborated with Seva Sahayog Foundation to train 20 women from Jambivali, a remote village from Karjat tehsil of Raigad district, for masala making skills.

Out of these 20 women, 13 women formed a self-help group named 'Kulaswami Mahila Bachat Gat'. The group started taking orders for masala products. They now sell their products at the weekly market. Active members of the group also sell their products at hotels of Karjat. They also get orders from the nearby residential areas. The group also takes order for catering during small functions at Karjat tehsil. The women are happy that they are able to improve their life through the skills they learnt and also proudly encourage others to do the same.
